BUILDING A NEW FIFE HIGH SCHOOL WOULD ALLOW THE DISTRICT TO:



ENHANCE STUDENT AND STAFF SAFETY

- → Allow for a single, secure entrance with updated security systems.
- → Accessibility updates would allow all students and staff access to a safe, modern building.



ADD CAPACITY TO SUPPORT STUDENT LEARNING

- → Add classrooms and expand common spaces to address overcrowding and give students space to eat lunch together indoors.
- → Add space to create richer Career & Technical Education (CTE) learning opportunities, including a focus on building trades, pre-apprenticeship classes, and providing students with the skills and experience to succeed in life.



MODERNIZE LEARNING SPACES AND BUILDING SYSTEMS

- → Add technology infrastructure that supports modern, collaborative teaching and learning.
- → Update HVAC and building systems so they are more cost-efficient and require less maintenance.

WHY IS FIFE PUBLIC SCHOOLS ASKING FOR A BOND?

The state provides minimal funding to address building construction and maintenance. School districts rely on local, voter-approved funding measures to cover these costs. Bonds allow the district to make a major investment upfront and pay it back over time. Local, voter-approved funding stays in our community to support Fife students.

HOW MUCH WILL IT COST?

The tax rate is estimated to be 67 cents per \$1,000 of assessed property value. This will generate \$204.8 million. Passage of the bond would also generate \$16.5 million in supplemental funds from the state.
